RECTOR REGULATION OF UNIVERSITAS PEMBANGUNAN NASIONAL VETERAN JAWA
TIMUR REGARDING SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES AT THE VETERAN
NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT UNIVERSITY OF EAST JAVA

WITH THE GRACE OF GOD ALMIGHTY

THE RECTOR OF UNIVERSITAS PEMBANGUNAN NASIONAL VETERAN JAWA TIMUR,

Considering:

- a. As an educational institution, it is obligated to provide services to students with special needs.
- b. that in the context of implementing the provisions of Law Number 8 of 2016 concerning Persons with Disabilities, it is necessary to guarantee services for persons with disabilities.
- c. Based on the considerations referred to in letters a and b, it is necessary to establish rector regulations regarding Services for Students with Disabilities at the Veteran National Development University of East Java.

In view of:

DECIDING

RECTOR REGULATION OF VETERAN NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT UNIVERSITY OF EAST JAVA REGARDING SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES IN THE VETERAN NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT UNIVERSITY OF EAST JAVA.

CHAPTER I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

In this reactor Regulation,

- (1) The Veteran National Development University of East Java, hereinafter abbreviated as UPN "Veteran" East Java, is a Public Service Agency State University.
- (2) The Rector is the highest leader at UPN "Veteran" East Java.
- (3) The Vice Rector for Student Affairs, Planning, Cooperation and Alumni is the leader under the Rector of UPN "Veteran" East Java who assists the Rector in the fields of student and alumni development;
- (4) The Dean is the highest leader and the person in charge of the faculties within UPN "Veteran" East Java.

(5) The Faculty is a collection of supporting resources that can be grouped according to study programs that organise and manage academic, vocational and/or professional education within 1 (one) discipline of science, technology, art and/or sports at UPN "Veteran" East Java;

(6) Students are registered and participating in educational activities at the university.

(7) Student services are activities to fulfil needs in accordance with statutory provisions for each student for goods, services, or administrative services provided by the university.

(8) People with disabilities are those who experience long-term physical, intellectual, mental, and/or sensory limitations who, in interacting with the environment, may experience obstacles and difficulties in participating fully and effectively on an equal basis with other citizens.

(9) Equality of opportunity is a condition that provides opportunities and/or access to Students with Disabilities to channel their potential in all aspects of inclusive and special education and learning.

(10) Protection is a conscious effort to protect, nurture, and strengthen the rights of disabled students.

(11) Discrimination refers to any distinction, exclusion, restriction, harassment, or exclusion based on disability with the intent or effect of restricting or eliminating the recognition, enjoyment, or exercise of the rights of Students with Disabilities.

(12) Respect is the attitude of appreciating or accepting the existence of Students with Disabilities with all their inherent rights without diminishing.

(13) Fulfillment is an effort made to fulfil, implement, and realise the rights of Students with Disabilities.

(14) Empowerment is an effort to strengthen the existence of Students with Disabilities by fostering a climate and developing their potential so that they are able to grow and develop into individuals or groups of Persons with Disabilities who are resilient and independent.

(15) Accessibility is the ease provided for Students with Disabilities to realise equality of opportunity.

(16) Reasonable Accommodation involves appropriate and necessary modifications and adjustments to ensure the enjoyment or exercise of all human rights and fundamental freedoms for Students with Disabilities on an equal basis.

CHAPTER II

PRINCIPLES, OBJECTIVES, SCOPE

Article 2

(1) The principles of service for students with disabilities are as follows.

- a) respect for dignity
- b) individual autonomy;
- c) Nondiscrimination
- d) Full participation.
- (e) Human diversity and humanity
- (f) Equality of opportunities
- g) equality;
- h) accessibility;
- i) Ever-evolving capacity and student identity
- j) inclusive; and
- (k) Special treatment and additional protection.

(2) The objectives of the services for students with disabilities are as follows:

- a) to realise full and equal respect, promotion, protection, and fulfilment of human rights and basic freedom for Students with Disabilities.
- b) To ensure efforts to respect, promote, protect, and fulfil rights as dignity inherent in students with disabilities
- c) to realise a better quality of life for students with disabilities who are just, physically, and spiritually prosperous, independent, and dignified.
- d) to protect students with disabilities from neglect and exploitation, harassment and all forms of discrimination, as well as violations of human rights; and

e) To ensure the implementation of efforts to respect, promote, protect, and fulfil the rights of students with disabilities to develop themselves and utilise all their abilities and interests to enjoy, participate, and contribute optimally, safely, freely, and dignified in all aspects of national, state, and social life.

Article 3

The scope of service regulations for students with disabilities is limited only to services within the campus for students registered at UPN “Veteran” Jawa Timur.

CHAPTER III

TYPES OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Article 4

(1) Types of students with disabilities included:

- a. Students with Physical Disabilities
- b. Students with intellectual disabilities.
- c. students with mental disabilities; and/or
- d. Students with sensory disabilities.

(2) The types of Students with Disabilities, as referred to in paragraph (1), can be experienced singly, multiple, or multi-disabilities for a long period of time as determined by medical personnel in accordance with statutory provisions.

CHAPTER IV

RIGHTS OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Article 5

Students with Disabilities who are currently studying at UPN “Veteran” East Java are entitled to scholarships consisting of:

- a. obtaining quality and equal education services at all types, paths and levels of education inclusively and specifically;
- b. Having equal opportunities to become members and/or leaders of student activities.
- c. obtaining reasonable accommodation services as students;

- d. Obtaining accessibility to public facilities belonging to the university
- e. obtaining reasonable accommodation services as a form of accessibility for individuals.
- f. obtaining optimal, reasonable and dignified accommodation in public services at UPN “Veteran” East Java without discrimination; and
- g. assistance, translation and provision of easily accessible facilities at UPN “Veteran” East Java in public service locations at no additional cost.

CHAPTER V

IMPLEMENTATION OF RESPECT, PROTECTION AND FULFILLMENT OF THE RIGHTS OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Article 6

- (1) The University, as the organiser of education and teaching, is required to plan, organise, and evaluate the implementation of respect, protection, and fulfilment of the rights of persons with disabilities.
- (2) In terms of the effectiveness of the implementation of respect, protection, and fulfilment of the rights of persons with disabilities, as referred to in paragraph (1), the university is required to formulate it in a strategic plan.
- (3) The University is required to provide adequate services and support infrastructure for students with disabilities.

CHAPTER VI SANCTIONS

Article 7

- (1) PNS and non-PNS employees in the Rector's Unit who do not provide equal and proper services to students with disabilities may be subject to PNS disciplinary sanctions or other sanctions in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
- (2) Units under the Rector who does not submit reports on planning, implementation, and evaluation of services for students with disabilities may be subject to sanctions in accordance with applicable regulations.

CHAPTER VII

TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

Article 8

When this Rector Regulation comes into force, all provisions regulating services for students with disabilities shall remain in effect as long as they do not conflict with its provisions of this Rector Regulation.

CHAPTER VIII

CLOSING

Article 9

The Rector Regulation shall come into force on the date of its stipulation.
